Unfortunately there are those in all industries who have been unable to do this and are saddled with very high overheads, this often leads to the temptation to get work at any cost including very unrealistic price reductions that are not sustainable without cutting down on quality.

Now we all know that you get what you pay for but how do you know what you should be getting? If you would like to see what is involved in making top quality curtains you are welcome at any time to call in and visit our workroom, just give me a call.

Some ladies certainly had their eyes opened a few weeks ago when they attended our workshop on window treatments that included a quick visit to the workroom.

We have heard and seen lately some totally unacceptable (to our way of working) issues that you should be aware of.

Several companies are having there curtains made overseas and in the examples we have seen and how they are delivered the quality is not good. The lead time is always long and even longer if something is not right and has to be fixed. Cutting down on the fullness of curtains to reduce the price doesn't always result in an acceptable finished product, single pleats in a curtain that means it is almost flat is not a good look and the curtain just doesn't sit or hang right. Always suggesting the cheapest fabric first off to clients instead of offering a full range and giving the client the opportunity to make a selection based on what works for her rather than assuming they only want cheap throughout the whole house.

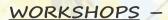

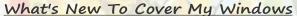
